ORDINANCE NO. 04-2019

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 120 "PEACE AND GOOD ORDER"
OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF CAPE MAY POINT**

WHEREAS, Chapter 120 Peace and Good Order of the Code of the Borough of Cape May Point provides a list of prohibited acts and activities within the limits of the Borough of Cape May Point; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Cape May Point believes it in the best interests of the Borough, its residents, and its visitors to restrict the hours that certain activities can occur.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 120 Peace and Good Order, Section 120-1 Prohibited Acts or Activities, is hereby amended as follows (deletions in ~~strikethrough~~, additions are underlined):

A) Section 120-1(n)(2):

(b) Using, operating or permitting to be played any radio set, television set, musical instrument, phonograph, lawn mower of any type, either power or manual, chainsaws, wood chippers/shredders, power washers or other machines or devices producing or reproducing sound, in such manner as to disturb the peace, quiet and comfort of the neighbors. The operation of any such sets, instruments, machines or devices between the hours of ~~4:00~~ 9:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m., prevailing time, in such a manner as to be plainly audible at a distance of fifty (50) feet from the building or vehicle in which it is located, shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this paragraph.

(d) Yelling, shouting, hooting, whistling or singing on the public streets or in any dwelling which shall disturb the comfort or repose of any person in the vicinity between the hours of ~~4:00~~ 9:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m., prevailing time.

B) Section 120-1(s)

s. Erect, demolish, alter, or repair any building or grounds or operate any tools or equipment used in construction, drilling, earthmoving, excavation or demolition work during proscribed hours as defined in Chapter 76, Construction Site Standards. In the event of urgent necessity, the Construction Official can issue a temporary special permit for a period of no longer than three (3) days to

~~cover the urgent necessity between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m., prevailing time, except in cases of urgent necessity, and then only with a permit from the Construction Official. The Construction Official shall determine prior to the issuance of such permit that the public health and safety will be impaired if the erection, excavation, demolition, alteration or repair is not performed immediately.~~

Section 2. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

Section 3. All ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect within twenty (20) days of final passage and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 05-2019

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 76 “CONSTRUCTION SITE STANDARDS” OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF CAPE MAY POINT

WHEREAS, Chapter 76 Construction Site Standards of the Code of the Borough of Cape May Point delineates standards applicable to all construction sites within the Borough of Cape May Point; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Cape May Point believes it in the best interests of the Borough, its residents, and its visitors to amend certain activities.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners as follows:

Section 1. Section 76-2 Definitions, is hereby amended to add the following:

Outside Construction Activities shall mean all exterior construction, to include demolition, excavation, and land grading, repairs, installation and improvement work including, without limitation, hardscape and landscape work, lot clearing, tree cutting using chain saws, wood chippers or similar equipment, foundation, framing, roofing, utilities conducted upon real property, whether residential or commercial, of any kind and nature and whether done by a a licensed contractor or an unlicensed individual upon private property. Outside painting without the use of power or motorized tools and equipment, lawn maintenance (but not landscaping services) and construction work performed entirely inside of any buildings or structures are excluded from the definition of outside construction activities.

Section 2. Section 76-3 shall be amended as follows (additions in underline, deletions in ~~strikethrough~~):

g. *Outside Construction Activities.* The Borough of Cape May Point is a vacation-oriented community, and both residents and visitors value quiet enjoyment of the Borough. In order to further quiet enjoyment of the Borough, allowable times for outside construction activities will be restricted as set out below. Engaging in outside construction activities is prohibited during the following days and times:

- (1) All days between the hours of 6:00 pm and 8:00 am.

- (2) On Saturdays, commencing on the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend until and including the Saturday of Labor Day weekend, all hours prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 3:00 p.m.
- (3) Sundays at all times.
- (4) On the recognized holidays of New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day at all times.

Noise. Borough Code Chapter 120, Section 120-1 provides that: ~~erection, excavation, demolition, alteration or repair of any building between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. prevailing time is prohibited~~ additional restrictions on certain activities not covered by this Chapter. In the event of urgent necessity, the Construction Official can issue a temporary special permit for a period of no longer than three (3) days to cover the urgent necessity.

h. *Job Site Cleanliness.* Contractors are responsible for keeping their construction sites in reasonable orderly condition by the conclusion of each working day. Contractors shall keep streets and sidewalks adjacent to the construction site broom clean and clear of soil, sand, gravel or other construction waste or debris. The objective is to avoid neighborhood eyesores, enhance public safety, prevent materials from entering storm drains, and minimize liability for curious children.

i. *Sediment Control.* Contractors shall install sediment control measures, either silt fences or silt socks, on the downhill side of the lot and along all streets adjacent to the lot during demolition, excavation, grading, or pile driving.

h. *Temporary Electrical Service.* In the case of demolition or other construction resulting in the need for, or suspension of, regular electrical service to the construction site the contractor shall provide temporary electrical service to the site via a "saw pole."

j. *Service Connections.* All utility service connections to all new construction or substantial improvement as defined in Section 90-2, Definitions, of Chapter 90, Flood Damage Prevention, shall be underground.

k. *Violations and Penalties.* Any person who shall violate this chapter or do any act or thing herein prohibited or refuse or fail to do any act or thing required to be done or refuse or fail to comply with any order of any Borough Official authorized to enforce this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof before any judicial officer authorized to hear and determine the matter, be liable to the penalty stated in Chapter 1, Section 1-5 for each offense. The Zoning Officer Code Enforcement Official and any other and all other aggrieved persons shall have the right of recourse to any and all remedies (whether injunctive, restraining order, mandamus or otherwise) or may hereafter be available by law.

Section 3. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

Section 4. All ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect within twenty (20) days of final passage and publication as provided by law.

WHEREAS, in cooperation with the NJDEP there have been numerous positive changes in the provision of additional beach access including handicap access in most coastal communities; and

WHEREAS, the individual municipalities need to govern their own public beach access in order to effectively and efficiently provide for the health, safety, and welfare of community residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, municipalities are most sensitive to their own particular geography, zoning laws, tourism objectives, and service goals which has resulted in beach tourism economic gains for the State of New Jersey in the billions of dollars annually with millions of daily beach visits by the public each year; and

WHEREAS, A-4221, sponsored by Assemblywoman Nancy J. Pinkin, District 18 (Middlesex) and Assemblyman Andrew Zwicker, District 16 (Hunterdon, Mercer, Middlesex, and Somerset) gives oversight and authority to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection without the knowledge, personnel or funding to protect the existing beach tourism industry that employs thousands of local people directly and indirectly; and
